Letter From Our Executive Director

When the COVID-19 pandemic hit last year, the team at Lion's Heart seamlessly pivoted and began finding virtual opportunities and vetting in-person opportunities for safety and social distancing protocols to ensure delivery of quality, pandemic appropriate, and safe volunteer opportunities to our teen members.

Not to my surprise, an incredible number of members rushed to help during COVID, having compassion and empathy for others from their time volunteering in Lion's Heart. They were ready to take on this pandemic in so many creative ways. Our members understood through the power of volunteering, that they COULD make a difference, even when the world around them is in a crisis. From making masks for donation to baking goodies to cheer up our front-line workers, Lion's Heart members have come together to help in creative ways that are truly impressive during this pandemic. Connecting with local restaurants, one member made thousands of cards and organized deliveries to local hospitals and the Red Cross for essential workers to thank them for all they are doing. Many baked cookies and treats, wrote cards, and made lunches, delivering them to hospitals for the nurses and respiratory therapists, and local fire and police stations. Mask making has become very popular with our members and thousands of masks and face shields have been sewn and delivered to local senior homes, hospitals, and homeless shelters. Many members, practicing CDC safety guidelines, continued to volunteer at food banks and soup kitchens over the holidays. One group helped provide free lunches to the families living in a shelter and another group organized and dropped off food they collected for a food drive. A group from Irvine joined The Steam Machine to help create virtual family scavenger hunts while another member created a website that locates locations for COVID-19 testing sites.

As the endless stories of our teen members making such a positive impact go on and on, I have been so honored to watch them continue to make a difference in their communities. "Our favorite volunteer opportunity is donating and participating in craft events and parties with homeless and underprivileged kids at Mercy House in Santa Ana. Bringing joy, laughter, and fun to the kids makes us smile just as much as it does them." ~ Irvine South 2022 Girls Blue Group Lion's Heart teens across the country served cumulatively over 1,450,000 volunteer hours in Lion's Heart all while learning how to set personal goals and take on new challenges. Plus, 1450 of our members earned the President's Volunteer Service Award, having volunteered over 100+ hours in honor of building stronger communities. That is guite an accomplishment!

Lion's Heart members continue to learn leadership, empathy, compassion and what it means to step out of their comfort zone to help someone in need, which is invaluable. I've been amazed by the stories I've heard from teens and parents who have been building leadership skills and connecting with important causes through volunteering. Our members continue to truly make a positive difference in their communities no matter what life throws at them and they will shine as young adults looking forward to the future as leaders.

2020 was a particularly difficult year, both emotionally and financially, for all of us. Here at Lion's Heart, we saw new enrollment come to a grinding halt once the Covid 19 pandemic began. We, as a team, went immediately into survival mode to keep Lion's Heart running smoothly and nurture our members during trying times. I'd like to thank all of our staff for their sacrifices, hard work and dedication to Lion's Heart. I'd also like to thank our members and their parents, adult volunteers, and our Board Members for their patience and guidance through these unprecedented times. Looking ahead, we are excited about our organization's continued success and growth.




